## CAMDEN TO LIBERTY

This is a two hour trip - at a poky speed - through a mix of hilly forest and farm land, a few small villages and past numerous lakes and streams. This trip is great for fall foliage viewing, makes a wonderful summer excursion, but best of all, you pay a visit to one of the most fascinating stores in Maine -- the **Liberty Tool Company**.

From the **MAINE STAY INN** turn right on Rt. 1 south.

At the flashing light by the Camden Library turn right on Rt. 52 north. (2 blocks)

Follow Rt. 52 north past Lake Megunticook into Lincolnville Center.

At Lincolnville Center take Rt. 173 to Searsmont. (15) Local legend has it that Ben Ames Williams used Searsmont as the model for his novel Fraternity Village. Stay on Rt. 173 to Liberty. (22)

There's not much in Liberty, so you won't have any difficulty finding the **Liberty Tool Company** [www.libertytoolco.com](http://www.libertytoolco.com). I have no problem with telling you where the store is, we really don't even need to tell you that it is on the west side of the road - you'll see it.

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The problem is in adequately describing what they sell. They don't sell new tools, they don't sell antique tools, they don't sell junk - they sell old tools. They also sell old books and some other old stuff, but the focus is definitely tools.

When you have finished rummaging through the bins of old wooden planes and stuff, continue north on Rt. 173 for about a mile until you come to Rt. 220. Turn left and head for South Liberty.

It's about five miles from Liberty to South Liberty. Watch for another left turn onto Rt. 105. Stay on 105 through Appleton, Hope and on to Camden.




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
